The Scottish Parliament - GB



When the Scotland act 1998 was passed, it led to the establishment of the first Scottish Parliament since 1707. Shortly after the act had been passed, a panel chaired by the First Minister, Donald Dewar, appointed architects from EMBT and RMJM Scotland Ltd for the momentous project of creating the Scottish Parliament building.



The new Scottish Parliament building incorporates a debating chamber, 6 committee rooms and facilities for the public and staff offices. ege® took part in this exciting project as supplier of all soft floorings, and supplied a total of 8,861 m² of custom design carpets in the highline 80/20, 1400 quality.
